Rep. Raja Krishnamoorthi Receives Safe Kids Worldwide Child Passenger Safety Award

Representative recognized for work to promote safety among high-risk, underserved kids

Itasca, IL. - Congressman Raja Krishnamoorthi received the distinguished Safe Kids Worldwide Child Passenger Safety Award today during a car seat and booster seat safety check event at the American Academy of Pediatrics (AAP) National Headquarters in Itasca. Presented by Safe Kids President Torine Creppy, the award recognized Rep. Krishnamoorthi for his work to promote child passenger safety in Illinois and across the country, particularly in communities that have historically been underserved.

The event also featured a car seat check component where certified child passenger safety technicians provided free car seat installation inspections to families in the community to ensure their car seats were used and installed correctly. Amazon sponsored the event by providing free car seats for those in need.

"I'm very grateful to be honored by Safe Kids with this award today," said Congressman Krishnamoorthi. "As a parent of three children myself, I know that the top priority for any parent is the safety of their children, which is why I was proud to introduce the Booster Seat Safety Act earlier this year to help improve federal booster seat standards for millions of children. I look forward to continuing my work with Safe Kids in the future to make sure that every child riding in a vehicle is safe in my congressional district and across the country."

"Safe Kids has prioritized protecting kids who are in high-risk, underserved communities and Rep. Earlier this year, Rep. Krishnamoorthi attended a car seat distribution event at Firman Community Center in Chicago to help distribute car seats to families in the community. The event also promoted Rep. Krishnamoorthi's legislation, the Booster Seat Safety Act, which would implement clear standards for booster seat labeling and safety testing.

According to NHTSA, 42 percent of children killed in car crashes were unrestrained. In addition, 46 percent of car seats and booster seats are used incorrectly. This makes events like car seat checks a critical component of ensuring child safety when riding in vehicles.
